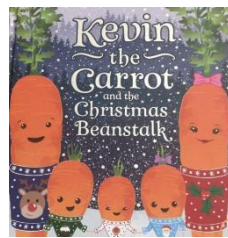
What are we learning in the Resourced Provision?



Key texts and topics

Autumn 2 is such a busy half term in the Butterfly room and around school!

Pupils take part in different mainstream class lessons as detailed in their individual transition plan. Below is information about the learning all pupils take part in at different points during the week in the Butterfly room. Please check the curriculum leaflets from the mainstream class your child is in for information about the learning take place when your child transitions into the mainstream class.



During the next few weeks, we will be learning about different themes in our half-termly topic **Celebrations**. Our weekly learning in current theme sessions, mystery box, thought of the week and book of the week will reflect this.

Examples of our learning will include Bonfire night, Remembrance Day, Children in Need, Diwali and Christmas preparation!

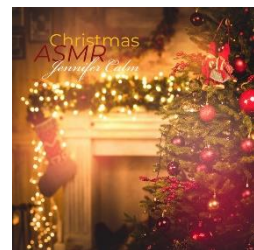
This should inspire some fantastic artwork and pieces of writing too!

Physical Development

Through our outdoor provision and daily sensory circuit opportunities, will be learning new games and action rhymes and developing our skills using tools and equipment. We will be also learning to get dressed and undressed for P.E so your child will need a P.E kit in school (please write their name in everything!) We will continue practising our letter formation, you can do this at home using the formation rhymes sent home to help.

Sensory Provision

Sensory provision is accessed daily by pupils in the Butterfly room. Weekly sensory activities are created which are linked to the different weekly themes. Themed tuff trays, sensory regulation (yoga, e.g.), immersive environments, etc. are some of the examples we will be using. Please look at the weekly information carefully for specific learning and activities.



Communication and Language

We will be talking about our favourite things and learning new words through the stories and discussions we have with the aim of learning to:

- Ask a variety of questions
- Tell others about our thoughts, feelings and opinions
- Listen and respond to others appropriately
- Apply new words in every day conversations

How you can help your child at home

Please talk to your child and ask them about their day. If they have a home/school diary, the information and photo will support this.

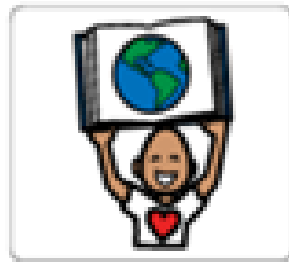
Please read at home! Whether it's stories, words on cereal packets, letters, magazines, reading is everywhere, enjoy reading with your child and they will enjoy reading to you, with you or just exploring sounds and words. Please try and explore the individual book sent home with your child. This book is matched to your child's individual phonics and reading level.

Please talk to your child about what is going on in the Butterfly room that week by using the weekly planning sent home.

Counting and recognising shapes in the environment is a great way for you to link what your child has been learning in school with the real life environment.

Encourage your child to be independent and to look after their things at school. It would also be a huge help if you could label their uniform with their name.
