Headteacher's Message

I hope everyone had a relaxing and enjoyable Easter break. The weather was definitely on our side and it was fantastic to see the cherry and apple blossoms in full bloom when I drove down Bracken Bank Crescent on the first day back to school after the Easter holidays.



This half term is particularly short—we have just 22 days of learning before we close on Thursday 22nd May for Spring Bank. Every single day is incredibly important, which brings me on to the subject of attendance and punctuality.

Our high expectations and rigorous approach to attendance mean that the vast majority of pupils attend school on time, every day. Space is already limited in the dining hall due to breakfast club's popularity—so please leave them in our capable hands and enjoy your day!






No Smoking or Vaping
