TRUST SAYS A FOND FAREWELL TO OUR DIRECTOR OF EDUCATION

IMPROVEMENT FUND SUCCESS FOR OUR SCHOOLS

We have successfully accessed £1.85 million from the government's Condition Improvement Fund – an annual bidding round for capital funding used to keep our schools' estates in safe and working order.

The funds have been split between four schools within our Trust: **Carrwood Primary School** for water infrastructure updates, **Overchurch Junior School** and **Tyldesley Primary School** to renew defective roofs and **Reeve Hill Primary School** for electrical and fire safety works.

Yvonne Brown, CEO, said: "We're very pleased to have

received funding from the Condition Improvement Fund to carry out essential works at our four schools. Safe, well-maintained buildings are vital, but not at the expense of other key areas like teaching, learning resources and enrichment.

"This funding allows our schools to focus their own resources on

what matters most, education and creating opportunities for our children."

The Department for Education allocated around £54 million from the Condition Improvement Fund, from a pot of over £460 million, to more than 100 schools in North West on May 30th 2025.

TRUST SATS RESULTS ON A THREE-YEAR POSITIVE TREND

Schools across the Trust were celebrating this year after securing another set of strong SATs results.

In fact, when compared to our results in 2023, our outcomes have significantly improved in every area that is assessed.

Our Trust averages in each of Reading, Writing and Maths have improved, with the overall combined average improving by 14%. Writing alone has improved by 10 percentage points.

Yvonne Brown, CEO said, "It is important to stress that examination results for children in primary schools are not something that should be defining. Our children are brilliant young people, and outcomes are just one part of a much bigger picture.

"That being said, our pupils have collectively achieved something pretty special this year – and it is right that is acknowledged and celebrated.

"What is also really encouraging is that more pupils in Reading and Maths have also been judged to working at Greater Depth, which is where a child is working at a consistently higher level. Every child is flourishing."



WORTH VALLEY PRIMARY SCHOOL ON THE ROAD TO OUTSTANDING

Worth Valley Primary School is celebrating a highly positive Ofsted report following a Section 8 inspection in April.

The two-day visit highlighted that the school has significantly improved since its last inspection in 2019, maintaining its 'Good' rating and now making strong progress towards an Outstanding outcome.

Inspectors praised the school's strong values, inclusive environment, and commitment to pupil well-being. Behaviour was described as exemplary, with a consistent approach that ensures every pupil feels valued and safe.

Leadership was recognised for its clear and ambitious vision, inspiring staff and pupils while driving continuous improvement. The Trust and Local Governing Body were also highlighted for their vital role in supporting and challenging the school to keep improving.

Parents echoed the report's findings, with 100% of respondents to Ofsted's ParentView survey agreeing their child is happy at the school.

Ceinwen Lodge, Headteacher at **Worth Valley Primary School**, said: "While Ofsted is not the only measure of success for a school, we are beyond proud to have the hard work and efforts of our pupils, staff and wider community recognised and celebrated.

"As the report notes, the well-being and safety of our children is our utmost priority. Getting this right means that our pupils have a solid foundation on which they can learn, grow as individuals and ultimately thrive."

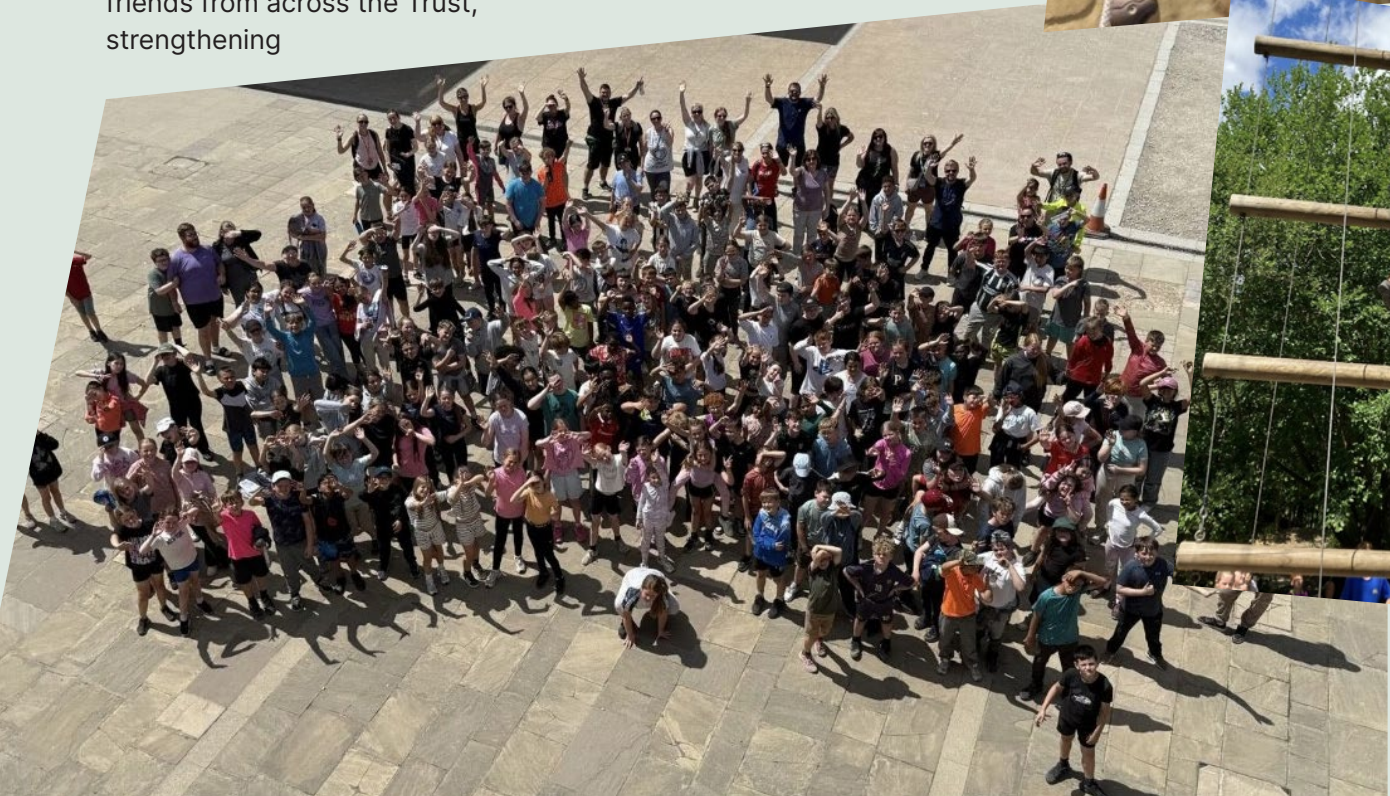
LEADING LEARNERS CONQUERS DEARNE VALLEY!

Tyldesley Primary School has achieved two fantastic accreditations this year!

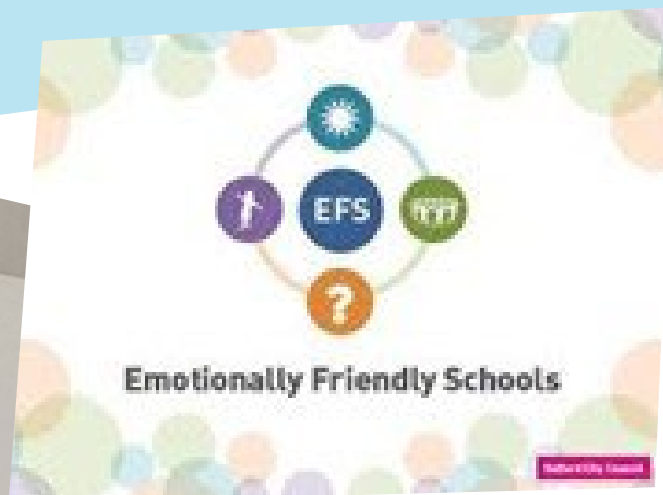
Early in the spring term, they were recognised as an ADHD Friendly School by the ADHD Foundation.
