

PE and Sport Premium Intended Spend 2025-2026

Overview of the PE and Sport Premium

The PE and Sport Premium is additional funding provided by the Government to help primary schools make sustainable improvements to the quality of their physical education (PE), physical activity and school sport provision. The funding is jointly provided by the Department for Education (DfE), the Department of Health and Social Care and the Department for Culture, Media and Sport.

Schools are required to use the funding to make additional and sustainable improvements to PE and sport, ensuring that all pupils develop healthy, active lifestyles. The funding must not be used to replace statutory provision and should be aligned with the national guidance on effective use of the PE and Sport Premium.

Worth Valley Primary School's PE and Sport Premium allocation for 2025–2026 is **£17,730**. There is no carry-forward from the previous academic year.
