


History



How have children's lives changed?
We are investigating the changes in children's lives through time, children learn how children's spare time, health, and work have changed. We will learn about a day in the life of a working child and the significance of Lord Shaftesbury in changing the lives of children.



English

This half term we are focusing on 'Charlie and the chocolate factory by Roald Dahl.

We are focusing on writing a character description. We will consider the character names and invent our own with accompanying descriptions using synonyms. We will write in the style of Roald Dahl to create a story detailing the lives of the Oompa Loompas before they became residents at the chocolate factory. Finally, we will create a machine for the chocolate factory and produce a description of one part of the process of its production.



Maths

Our focus in maths this half term will start with perimeter. We will then move on to mass and capacity. We will learn to measure, read scales, compare, add and subtract in grams, kilograms, millilitres and litres.





Computing
