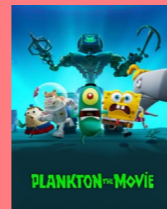

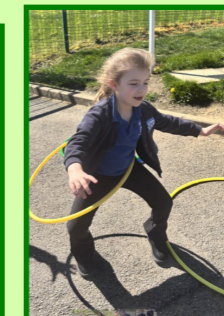
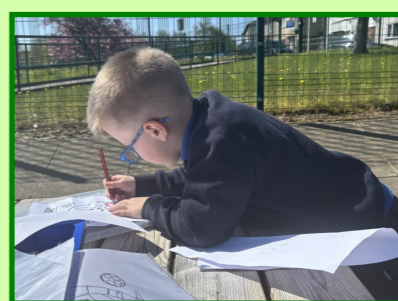
Headteacher's Message

Items from home, including "sensory" toys

We would like to take this opportunity to remind you of our expectations regarding pupils bringing personal items, including so-called "sensory" toys or objects, into school.

It remains the case that we ask all personal items to be left at home. Items brought into school can easily become lost or damaged and - in many cases - can distract from pupils' learning.

We recognise that some children may benefit from specific resources to support their needs. Where a particular item is recommended as part of a child's EHCP, or has been advised by a relevant health professional, this will of course be supported, accommodated and provided by the school.

However, unless there is an agreed and evidenced need, pupils will not be permitted to use or wear personal sensory items during the school day.

We appreciate your support in helping us maintain a focused and purposeful learning environment for all pupils.



Parking

A quick reminder to all parents and carers about parking on Bracken Bank Crescent. Please park carefully and considerately, avoiding the pavement wherever possible, and do not park on the yellow zig-zag lines. These measures are in place to keep everyone safe, and it's important that all children and their families can travel to and from school safely.

While we do our best to remind and encourage safe parking, schools are not responsible for enforcing parking restrictions outside the school. This is the responsibility of the local authority and their parking enforcement officers. If you have concerns about unsafe or inconsiderate parking, you can report this to the local council.

It's also been great to see so many children coming to school on their bikes and scooters. We would just ask that, for safety reasons, all children cycling or scooting to school wear a helmet.

Keep the zig-zags clear – no excuses!

The zig-zags are there for a purpose: To provide a clear area in which children can cross more safely

Please remember

- Don't let very young children out on their own.
- Make sure that they know roads are dangerous.
- Because of their size, children cannot see if the road is clear from behind parked cars.
- Drivers cannot see small children hidden by parked cars.
- When children go to and from school, there is usually a lot of traffic.

Can you park on Yellow zig zag lines outside a school?

Yellow zig zag lines and School Keep Clear markings outside schools that have signs listing the hours of operation will be enforced by the local council; this will include use of camera cars, CCTV or parking wardens to issue a penalty charge notice. The hours stated on signs usually relate to drop off and pick up times. You cannot drop off, pick up, wait or stop on zig zag lines and School Keep Clear markings during the hours of operation.
